1. IITTM organizes Post Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM) programmes in Tourism & Travel, Tourism & Leisure, Services, International Tourism Business, Tourism & Logistics and Tourism and Cargo. Courses are selectively offered at the Gwalior main campus and its centers Bhubaneswar, New Delhi and Nellore.
2. **Admission Procedure:** Admission to PGDM programme will be made on the basis of overall performance in written test, group discussion (GD) and personal interview (PI). Short listed students will be called for GD and PI at Gwalior (April 6-8, 2011), Bhubaneswar (March 31-31, 2011) and New Delhi (April 2-4, 2011). The admission will be made during counseling strictly on the basis of overall merit comprising of performance at written test, group discussion and personal interview.
