2. **Admission Procedure:** Admission to PGDM programme will be made on the basis of overall performance in written test, group discussion (GD) and personal interview (PI). Short listed students will be called for GD and PI at Gwalior, Bhubaneswar and New Delhi during 19th to 21st June, 2009. The admission will be made during counseling strictly on the basis of overall merit determined comprising of performance at written test, group discussion and personal interview.
